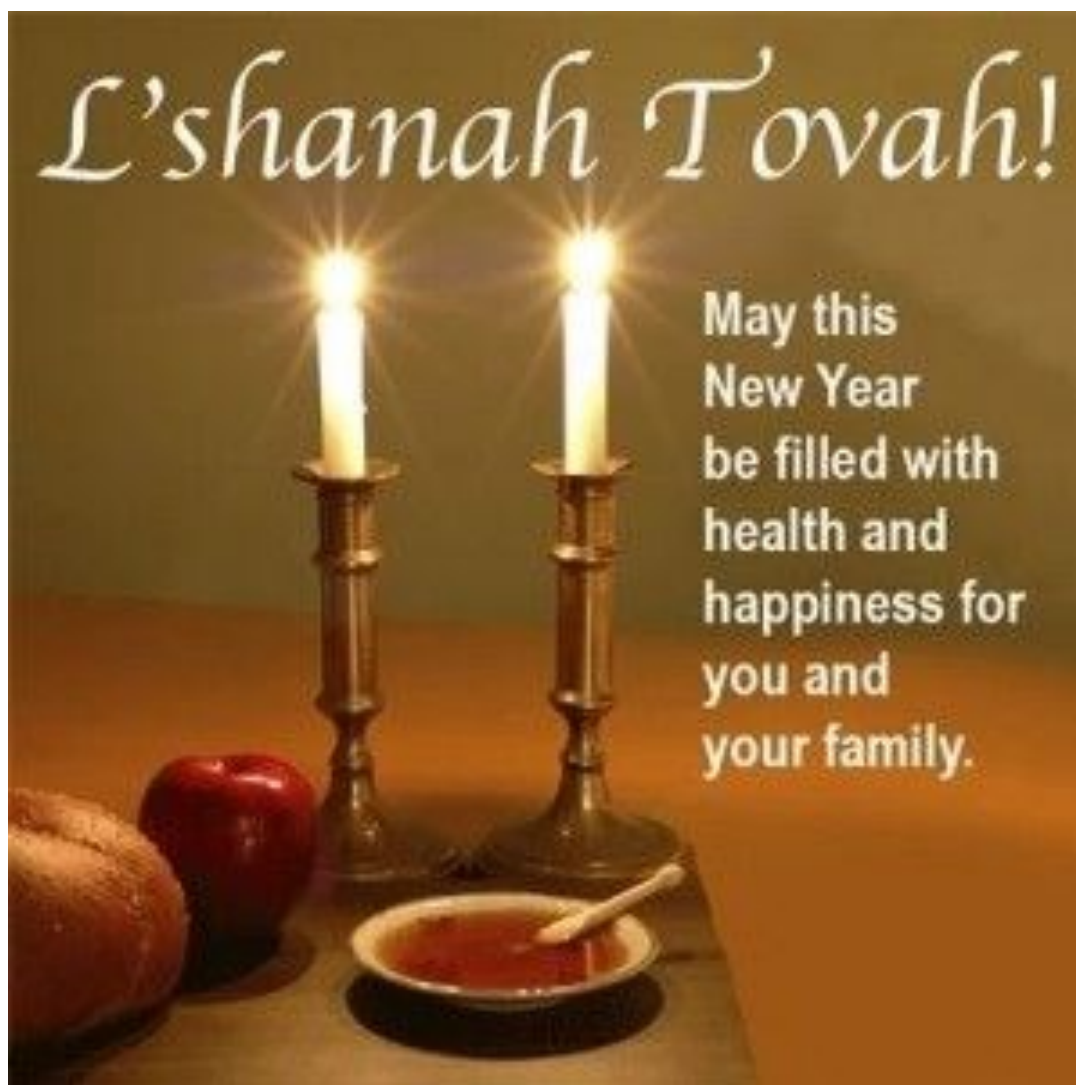

Annual Giving — Strength to Strength

The High Holidays are my favorite time of the year: more people come together as a Jewish community than at any other time of the year. The clergy recognizes this as an opportunity to speak on important topics and provide inspiration and meaning.

Here, at Temple Beth Sholom it's also the time of year when we kick-off our annual Strength to Strength Campaign. Last year's campaign exceeded our budgeted amount because of our great congregants answering our call. As a result, we ended our fiscal year with a surplus. Some of this surplus will be used to fund programs this fiscal year.

Our members really know how to answer the call when called upon! 71% of the congregation donated to the Strength to Strength campaign, and 70% of those donations were either the same or higher than the previous year!

This year's Budget committee worked hard not to increase the amount needed by Strength to Strength to fund our operations. Unfortunately, the amount for this year's campaign is \$115,000.

While you are sitting in *Shul* on Kol Nidre, and listening to the Strength to Strength campaign speech, please consider donating to the campaign. The popular saying is "No gift is too small." We'd love to have a greater participation this year so even \$18, \$36, \$50, or \$100 means a great deal to the campaign. If you gave in previous years, thank you! If not, please consider a token amount; every dollar of your donation goes straight to our bottom line and strengthens our community.

I look forward to seeing everyone in services this year and get a chance to not only pray with you but to welcome you and shake your hands as we walk around the sanctuary with the Torahs.

Baruch attah Adonai, Eloheinu Melekh Ha-olam, asher kid'shanu b'mitzvotav v'tzinvanu l'hadlik ner shel yom tov.

Praised are You, Lord our God, King of the universe, whose mitzvot adds holiness to our lives and who gave the mitzvah to kindle light for the festival.

Recite this blessing after lighting the candles both nights:

Blessings for Friday Yom Kippur: light the candles, then recite the following brachot:

בָּרוּךְ אַתָּה ה' אֱלֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶךְ הָעוֹלָם, אֲשֶׁר קִדְּשָׁנוּ בְּמִצְוֹתָיו, וְצִוָּנוּ לְהַדְלִיק נֵר שֶׁל שַׁבָּת וְשֶׁל יוֹם הַכִּיפּוּרִים.

Baruch attah Adonai, Eloheynu Melech Ha-olam, asher kid'shanu b'mitzvotav v'tzinvanu l'hadlik ner shel Shabbat v'shel yom hakippurim.

Praised are You, Lord our God, King of the universe, whose mitzvot adds holiness to our lives and who gave the mitzvah to kindle light for Yom Kippur.

Recite afterwards the Shehecheyanu.

בָּרוּךְ אַתָּה ה' אֱלֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶךְ הָעוֹלָם, שֶׁהֵחֵינּוּ וְקִיְּמָנוּ וְהִגִּיעָנוּ לְזִמְן הַזֶּה.

Baruch attah Adonai, Eloheynu Melech Ha-olam, asher kid'shanu b'mitzvotav v'tzinvanu l'hadlik ner shel yom tov.

Praised are You, Lord our God, King of the universe, whose mitzvot adds holiness to our lives and who gave the mitzvah to kindle light for the festival.

Recite this blessing after lighting the candles on all nights:

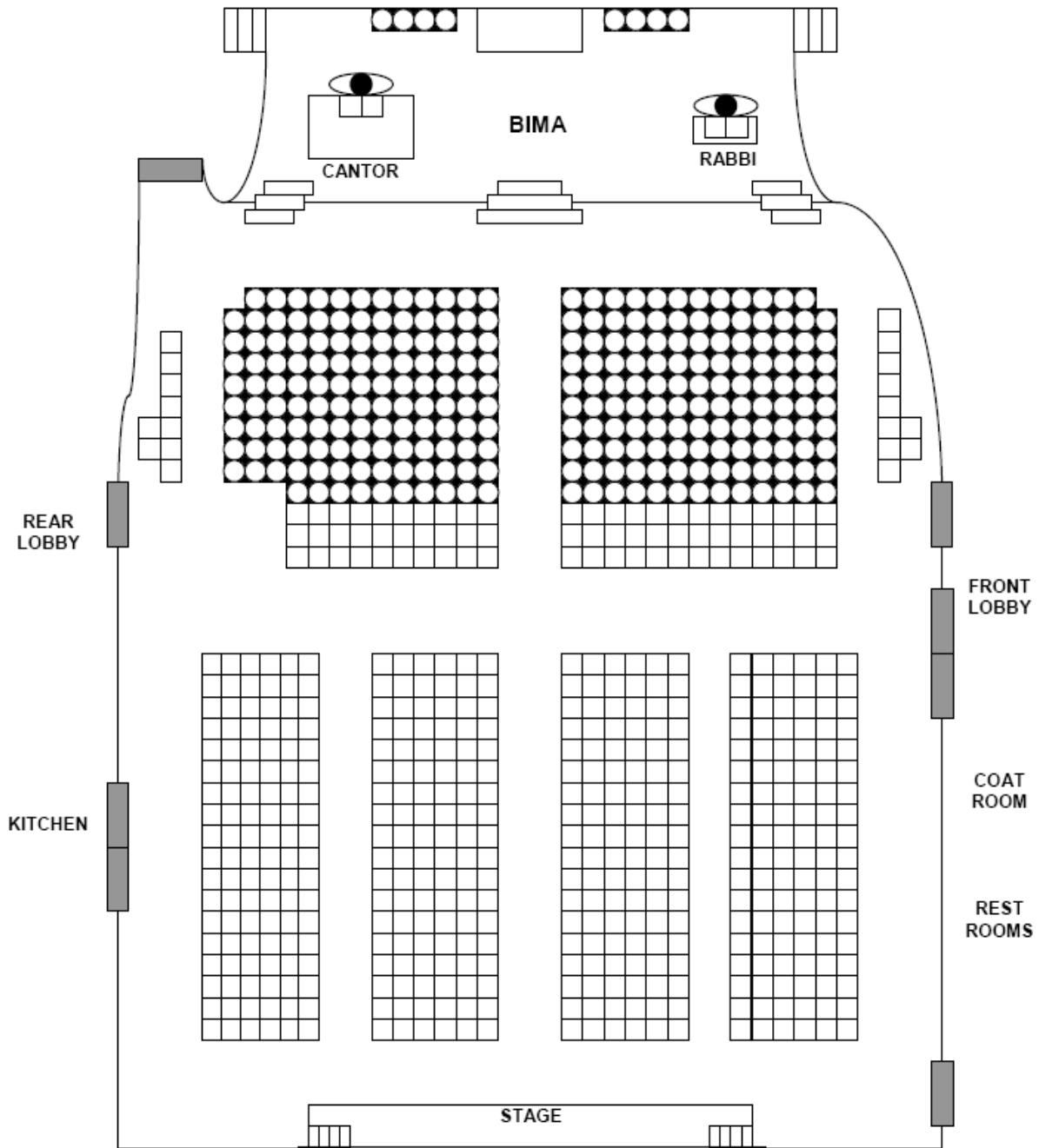

HIGH HOLIDAY TICKET POLICY

Members of Temple Beth Sholom in good standing* will be issued tickets for Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur according to the following schedule:

Member seats	\$140.00 each
Children Grades 6 through High School Graduation	Voluntary donation
Children Under 12 years old	\$75.00 each
Unmarried children ages 19 — 24	\$90.00 each
Children 25 and over, married children	\$140.00 each
Non-member immediate family	\$140.00 each
Non-member unrelated	\$360.00 each

TICKETS MUST BE PRESENTED UPON ENTERING THE BUILDING

* In order to receive High Holiday seats, 20% of your dues must be paid by September 1, 2015, or, if a payment plan has been established, the amount required by September 1 must have been paid.

HIGH HOLIDAY PARKING POLICY

In order to insure safety and efficiency during the High Holidays please adhere to the following parking guidelines:

- **Spring Lane should be used for your arrival route and Pamela Road for your departure.** By doing this, traffic flows in a one way pattern.
- On the short piece of Pamela Road after the intersection of Spring Lane, please park on the right (side of road with the two houses). This will leave enough room for parking and for traffic to enter and exit the Temple parking lot at the same time.
- Do not make your own space. All spaces have been marked by yellow lines. Trying to squeeze in a space at the end of a row will impede Emergency Vehicles.
- There are a limited number of Handicapped Parking Spaces. These spaces are reserved for automobiles with an officially issued Handicapped Parking Placard.
- Parking is not allowed behind the building as it is an emergency egress.
- The custodians and a police officer will be in the parking lot to assist with the flow of traffic.
- Please remember we are in a residential neighborhood.
Framingham Schools will be closed and children will be present on the streets.
Do not block driveways and keep your speed down.
Park on the even numbered side of the road to meet town requirements

TEMPLE GUIDELINES

- Please enter the building through the front door with your admission ticket. Tickets are issued to those members whose dues and fees are current. No one will be admitted without a ticket.
- Please note that seat numbers for each family are printed on one ticket only.
- For security purposes, there will be a police presence during the services and ushers will be checking tickets at the door. We will make every attempt to make this as unobtrusive as possible. If you forget your tickets, the ushers will have a master list showing your seat assignment.
- As a security measure, we reserve the right to inspect all bags.
- **All seats are assigned for all services.**
- Due to fire laws, please keep aisles open. Be mindful of strollers and baby carriages.
- Please maintain the sanctity of services by dressing appropriately for the High Holidays and limiting conversation.
 - Traditional dress for the High Holidays is white.
 - Appropriate dress for Yom Kippur includes no leather shoes. Sneakers are acceptable, and encouraged.
 - **Dress code for 2nd Day of Rosh Hashanah is Business Casual**
- Please be aware of all building exits, and follow directions of ushers in case of emergency.
- **During certain portions of the service, entry into the main sanctuary is restricted. Follow directions of the ushers. Ushers have full discretion when the congregation may enter from the rear of the sanctuary.**
- **Please do not exit or enter Sanctuary**
 - **While the ark is open**
 - **The Rabbi or the President is speaking**
 - **During the beginning of the Amidah or the Kedusha**
- **Please turn off all electronic devices before entering the building, including cell phones, pagers and beepers.**
- Please cooperate with ushers at all times.
- Please remember, some people are highly allergic to perfume/cologne. Please show consideration.
