Kindling the Chanukah Lights

On each of the eight nights of Chanukah, candles are lit, one the first night, two the second, adding one candle each subsequent night. One candle, designated *shamash*, is used to light the others. The first candle, for the first night, is placed on the far-right side of the Chanukah Menorah. Starting on the second night, the candles are lit in order from left to right. The *berakhot* are recited before the candles are lit. It is traditional to put the Menorah in a place that everyone can see it and rejoice in the miracle. The first night of Chanukah begins on Sunday, December 22, 2019, after sundown.

(Recite blessings #1, #2, and #3 on the first night only. Recite blessings #1 and #2 the rest of the nights. On Friday night, December 27th, light candles before Shabbat candles, #4)
